1. APOLOGIES

 $A pologies for their in ability to attend the Meeting were received from Councillors Agelink \ and Trite.$

2. **REFURBISHMENTSCHEME**

Further to Minute No.6 of the Special Meeting of the Council held on 5 \$\$ th March 2004, Mr. Craig Calling ham of Leisure Concepts, the Council's appointed consultant, gave a detailed analysis of the amended proposal submitted by Elm Contracts, which showed a potential saving of approximately £83,700 on the original tender price submitted.

Duringtheensuingdiscussion, Membersexpressed concernt hat the savings should not be achieved through lower standards of materials, finishes or work manship, and they were given an assurance by Leisure Concepts that the quality of the refurbishments cheme would be maintained, although some materials and finishes had yet to be determined.

The Mayor referred to previous discussions, where by consideration had been given to the possibility of re-tendering for the refurbishment project in the autumn to allow the contractors extratime to prepare their submission. Hether posed the question to Mr. Callingham:-

Ifthecontractorswereinvitedtore-tender, could Leisure

Contractsnegotiateabetterprice?

Mr.Callinghamwasoftheopinionthattore-tenderwouldnotnecessarilyresultinalower pricedcontract,particularlyasfavourablenegotiationswerecontinuingwithElmContractors,who hadinitiallysubmittedthelowesttender.

The Town Clerk confirmed that the tendering and evaluation process had been carried out in accordance with the Council's Standing Orders, and it was AGREED:-
