Partnershipalsoencompassedtheneighbouringparishes.

<u>MR.VANDEZANDE</u> expressed his concernfor thesafety of pedestrians on Shore Road due to the increased drop from the pavement to the beach caused by the erosion of the sand, and enquired whether railings could be erected as a safety measure. He was informed by the <u>TOWNCLERK</u> that this risk had been identified and assessed. The risk was deemed to be so "obvious", similar to the areal eading to the Stone Quay, that it was an individual's duty of care to take reasonable precaution in such instances.

<u>MR.ROBERTS</u> referred to the development of private beach huts at North Beach, and the subsequent restriction of the foot path along the seawall. The to be a public foot path, but part of the seadefences, and that the land to which here ferred was in private ownership.
