Councillor Miller (Town Mayor) welcomed those present, and invited questions from the audience.

MR.ROBERTS referredtothereductionintheCouncil'sdebt,andwhilstacknowledgingthegood managementoftheCouncil'sfinances,feltthatthishadbeenachievedatthedetrimentofsomeofthe essentialservices. Hemadeparticularmentionofstreetcleaningandtoiletfacilities. Inreply, the MAYOR explained that street cleaning and litter collection in the town was the responsibility of Purbeck District Council, but regular meetings were held with representatives from that authority and their contractors, SITA, in order to improve these rvice where possible, and address any specific issues that may arise. The toiletfacilities were provided and maintained by the Town Council, and the Mayor explained the proposals for the toilet sat Day's Park (which would be converted to 1 unisex facility) and other capital projects. He suggested that Mr. Roberts remain in the meeting to observe an agendaitem related to this matter.
