# 6. <u>STATEMENT OF POLICY ON THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT PENSION</u> <u>SCHEME 2014 DISCRETIONS</u>

The Clerk reported on amendments to the Local Government Pension Scheme 2014, which included the requirement for the Town Council to adopt a Discretions Policy.

Following a brief discussion, it was proposed by the Town Mayor, seconded by Councillor Poultney, and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:-

That the Town Council's draft Statement of Policy on The Local Government Pension Scheme 2014 Discretions be approved and adopted.

### 7. SEAFRONT AND DOWNS STABILISATION SCHEMES

Further to Minute No. 35 of the Council Meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2014, the Clerk was pleased to report that work on the Downs Stabilisation Scheme would be completed by the end of June 2014.

The new toilet block on Shore Road was on target to be completed by mid-July.

## 8. <u>COMMENTS ON PLANNING APPLICATIONS</u>

Further to an issue raised during a previous Public Participation session, consideration was given to the Town Council's policy regarding comments on planning applications in which it has an interest.

The Clerk reported that the Council's existing policy was not to comment on planning applications in which it had an interest as a corporate body, although in cases where Members felt there were wider issues of public interest at stake that position could be reviewed and appropriate advice taken. The position was noted.

# 9. GAS DRILLING – CALIFORNIA QUARRY

Consideration was given to matters of concern raised by local residents in relation to the proposed gas drilling at California Quarry and related vehicle movements. During the discussion concerns were expressed regarding the comprehensiveness of information provided by Infrastrata relating to the proposals.

It was noted that a meeting had been arranged between the Town Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Chairman of the Transport Committee and representatives from Infrastrata on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> June. The Town Mayor asked that she be informed of any issues of concern so that they could be aired at that meeting.

# 10. **DEMENTIA FRIENDLY TOWN**

The Town Mayor reported on a proposal from Dorset Partnership for Older People that Swanage becomes a 'Dementia Friendly' town, and recognises the problems experienced by dementia patients and their families.

Following discussion, it was proposed by the Town Mayor, seconded by Councillor Bonfield, and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:-

That the Town Council fully supports the proposal for Swanage to be designated as a 'Dementia Friendly' town.

- (a) On appeal, approval had been granted by the Planning Inspectorate for the construction of 52 dwellings on land adjoining the former Grammar School site.
