Public Participation Time

There was one member of the public present.

1. Apologies

Apologies for their inability to attend the Meeting were received from Councillors Miss Harris and Mrs Patrick, Mr A Lander (Swanage Fisherman's Association) and Mr M Green (James Smith Funeral Directors).

2. Declarations Of Interest

Members were invited to declare their interest under the Code of Conduct as defined by regulations made under section 30 (3) of the Localism Act 2011.

There were no declarations to record on this occasion.

3. <u>Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Meeting of the General Operations</u> Committee held on 3rd July 2013

There were no matters arising.

4. Allotment Matters

a) Use of Seaweed at Prospect Allotments

Further to a request from Prospect Allotments Association for the Council to deliver seaweed to Prospect Allotments, consideration was given to the practise of the use of seaweed at the allotments. It was reported that in previous years seaweed had been delivered to the allotments, but due to a number of complaints from local residents regarding the stench of rotting seaweed the deliveries had been discontinued. Following a brief discussion it was proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Councillor Poultney and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY

That the Town Council would be unable to sanction the delivery of seaweed to

Prospect Allotments, but would have no objection to plot holders liaising with the council's contractor to deliver seaweed to individual plots to be dug in during the winter months and for the matter to be reviewed at the General Operations Committee Meeting due to be held on 19th March 2014.

5. Budget Setting 2014/15

a) Capital Programme Monitoring and Plans for 2014/15

In line with the agreed capital programme for 2013/14, it was noted that a quote had now been received for the snowplough accessory for the multifunctional vehicle and would be put on order in preparation for the winter months.

It was reported that the quote to re-surface North Beach car park had now come in at £42,000, £12,000 over the estimated budget.

It was further RESOLVED:

That the Meadowland Burial Ground charge for the interment of a child whose age did not exceed 3 years at the time of death be reduced to £90.

6. Spa Bungalows - Plans for 2014 Summer Season

Attention was drawn to the poor condition of the 35 beach huts at the Spa. It was reported that a number of beach huts that were in good condition would be removed from Shore Road during the seafront stabilisation works and it was suggested that these could be utilised at the Spa site. It was noted that not all the huts could be replaced. It was proposed by Councillor Mrs Bartlett, seconded by Councillor Mrs Marsh and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:

That 8 of the Spa Bungalows be removed and the remaining 27 be refurbished utilising redundant beach huts from Shore Road.

7. Operations Manager's Report

The Operations Manager gave a brief report on the following:

a) Dog Fouling – Northbrook/Godlingston Cemetery and King Georges/ Queen Elizabeth's Playing Fields Concern was expressed at the amount of dog fouling in the Town Council's cemeteries and public spaces. It was reported that despite signage and additional patrols by the Town Council's enforcement officers the situation was an environmental hazard.

It was proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Councillor Pratt and RESOLVED UNANIIMOUSLY:

That the possibility of introducing a dog ban in the Town Council cemeteries be investigated.

It was further proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Councillor Mrs Marsh and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:

That the Town Council publicise the current anti-social behaviour of a minority of dog owners and state that unless dog owners become responsible for their pets, consideration would be given to a total ban on dogs in Town Council owned public open spaces.

b) Godlingston Cemetery – Future Plans

Attention was drawn to the matter of future grave space in Godlingston Cemetery. It was noted that sufficient time would need to be allowed for planning and preparation of reports and proposals to extend the cemetery. It was proposed by Councillor Poultney, seconded by Councillor Brown and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:

That proposed plans are drawn up for the future extension of Godlingston Cemetery.

8. Town Council Depot – Potential Relocation

Further to minute 9) of the Policy & Planning meeting held 18th November 2013, there were no additional matters to consider regarding the possible relocation of the Town Council Depot at the present time.

9. Items of Information and Matters for Forthcoming Agendas

- **a**) Further to a request for an inscription on the reverse of a memorial in Godlingston Cemetery and in line with agreed delegation arrangements, it was agreed not to allow any variation in the options currently available for memorials.
- **b**) It was reported that representatives of the Town Council had attended an enjoyable and interesting presentation on potential improvements to public open spaces by pupils of The Swanage School.
