1) Election of Chairman

6) Budget Setting 2014/15

a) Review of Tourism Budgets

A brief update was given on the Tourism Budgets for 2014/15.

b) Scale of Charges 2013/14 – Recommendations to Estimates Meeting

i) Provision of Beach Huts - Consideration of Charges for 2014/15

Consideration was given to a briefing note outlining proposed beach hut charges on Shore Road for 2014/15 following the redevelopment of the site as part of the Seafront Stabilisation Scheme. It was proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Councillor Whitwham and RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:-

ii) Pricing Structure for Premium Huts

7) Future of Swanage Market – Discussion of Future Options

Consideration was given to the future viability of Swanage Market which is held on Tuesdays in Main Beach car park between April and October. It was noted that total tolls collected by the current market operator, Ensors, had fallen by more than 50% in three years. It is believed to have been due to fewer traders working local markets in the current economic climate. It was also suggested that the town centre was noticeably quieter whilst the market is in operation and it was felt that a site closer to the town would encourage visitors to browse the shops as well. Nevertheless widespread support for a Swanage Market was expressed by those present and the possibility of holding car boot sales was also raised. It was agreed that these comments would be considered by the Finance & Performance Committee when it next discussed this issue.

8) Tourism Reports

Mrs C Hooper, Swanage Tourist Information Centre Supervisor, reported on the following matters:-

a) BMX & Skate Festival

This year saw the launch of a new BMX & Skate Festival for Swanage which proved to be very successful. The organisers have promised to have more trick bike artists for 2014 and it is hoped that this festival will continue to grow and be a popular event for young and old alike.

b) Litter Free Coast & Sea

The Tourist Information Centre have worked closely with Litter Free Coast & Sea. They have produced posters for next year's campaigns which can be interactive with the public's photographs. It is hoped this initiative will highlight their aims along the Dorset Coast.

Ms H Lagden Tourism Officer, reported on the following matters:-

a) Award Ceremony

A new award ceremony for the Dorset Tourism Industry was launched this year. The ceremony was held on the 5th October at the Tank Music and there were 60 entries in 12 different categories, with 7 Purbeck businesses including Discover Purbeck information centre winning awards. It was felt that the process of entering the award was worthwhile providing a good opportunity to look at plans for the coming year and for businesses to challenge themselves to make improvements.

b) Swanage & Purbeck Holiday Guide

The Swanage and Purbeck Holiday Guide has now gone to print and 50,000 copies have been produced. There were over 100 businesses opting to participate in the guide again this year.

c) Visit-England Online

Visit-England online will feature Swanage Railway, Corfe Castle and the Enid Blyton Connection under the section Coastal Family Holidays and Active Holidays in January 2014.

9) <u>Updates from Outside Representatives</u>

Swanage & Purbeck Hospitality Association

It was reported that accommodation providers had had a better year in general but that visitor numbers were still down approximately 10% on 2011. There had been a drive on association membership which had seen interest from over 200 businesses and it was intended that the Association would become more active on social media. It was noted that the A.G.M. would be held on 20th March 2014 at 11.00 a.m.

Swanage & District Chamber of Trade & Commerce

Following the recent appointment of the new Chairman the main focus had been on building relationships for the Chamber of Trade. It was noted that there are 28 outlets in Swanage that display art and it was suggested that it would be wonderful to promote Swanage and Purbeck as an area to visit for its art and culture.

Swanage Railway

Passenger numbers for the year have exceeded 191,000 for the first time since 2010. Events have proved successful this year and there are more to come in the run up to Christmas. Swanage Railway has received a 'Supporting Tourism in Poole'award as part of the 2013 Poole Sibbett Gregory Tourism Awards, in recognition of its excellence and contribution to the local economy. Work on the signalling system between Poole and Wool is due to take place which would enable tour trains to have a faster transit along the Swanage branch after commissioning; it would also remove the current limit of 12 main line passenger trains each year.

10) Items of Information and Matters for Forthcoming Agendas

- a) It was reported that armed forces day would be held on the 28th June 2014, celebrating the 30th anniversary of the link between the 11th Signals Regiment and the town.
- **b**) The town's Civic Service would be held on Sunday 29th June 2014.
- c) It was noted that Switch on Swanage would switch on the Christmas lights in the town on Saturday 30th November.

11) Beach Gardens – Request for Permission to Erect Awning at Swanage Bowls Club

In the absence of the Chairman it was agreed to defer the matter, to be discussed at the Policy and Planning Meeting due to be held on the 18th November 2013.

12) Date of Next Meeting

It was noted that the date of the next meeting had been scheduled for Monday 3rd March 2014.
