Purbeck Film Festival

The annual Purbeck Film Festival is marking its 28th year with another programme of films old and new, certain to appeal to seasoned cinemagoers or anyone wanting a good night out. More than 80 films are being screened in over 30 venues across Purbeck from **October 20 to November 4**, ranging from popular cinemas the Mowlem in Swanage and Wareham's magnificent Rex, to village and church halls, Durlston Castle – and a tennis and croquet club. There are four Q&As with directors and film industry guests, two French evenings, a Spanish and New Zealand evening, one pre-view documentary, and some nostalgic English films, including Tony Hancock's *Punch and Judy Man*, which is celebrating its 60th anniversary. The patrons of this year's festival are Bafta-nominated screenwriter Olivia Hetreed, producer Andy Paterson and gifted actor and playwright Sir Mark Rylance. Their support gives a boost to the small group of volunteers who organise the festival.
