THE SWANAGE SCHOOL

PRIDE AND PROTECTION

Our students and teachers have always given us reason to be proud. This time the pride we feel for Eden Shaffer is part of a national pride we feel for all those engaging in the battle against coronavirus.

Eden, inspired and frustrated by his mother's need as a frontline key worker, used his own 3D printer to create a protective face shield to help keep her safe. Before long Eden contacted his school and The Swanage School DT Department, its teachers and a host of volunteer students were mobilised; social distancing was maintained at all times.

Thanks to their hard work what started as a 13 year old boy, at home seeking to protect his mum, soon turned into a national effort, with hospitals as far afield as Kings College Hospital in London ordering protective shields to help keep their workers safe on the front line. In total our DT Department has supplied 29 establishments: care homes, hospitals, medical practices, shops and maternity wards among their number; many are local, but Eden's face shields are even being worn by medical staff in Llandough Hospital in Wales.

On Thursday night at 8pm, as we clap for our NHS and other key workers, I for one will be clapping for Eden too.

The Swanage Medical Practice

To all patients, staff and friends of Swanage Medical Practice

It is four weeks since the UK had 50 Covid-19 deaths. Sadly, this has now risen to over 20,000. The virus is now well established in Swanage and Purbeck. Fortunately, despite this, Swanage Surgery and town seem to have made a good transition to a new way of living and working.

We are still running our twice daily 'Sit and Wait' surgery and offering routine appointments, but, in the first instance, these are all by phone or video. Since the epidemic, we have reorganised our provision of care for the foreseeable future. Most days we have a paramedic, Tammy and our prescribing Nurse Practitioner, Ali, or our prescribing Nurse Jane, available to phone you or potentially see you. They are always still supported by at least 2 of your Swanage GPs. All GPs are still doing routine surgeries. 90% of consultations are now being done by phone, video link or eConsult. At times your doctors and staff will be working from home as we have now been provided with securely connected laptops.

e-Consult For those of you who have access to a home computer, e-Consult is a brand new online service bringing choice to patients who want to consult online, and in many cases avoiding the need to visit their GP practice altogether, saving time and journeys. Available via our website (www.swanagemedical.org.uk)

On Mon-Fri, patients can submit their symptoms online and will get a response within 48 hours. This could be advice, directed to other support such as the pharmacy, or booked in for an appointment if necessary. The service also offers around the clock NHS self-help information and a symptom checker. Patients can also request prescriptions, test results, referral letters and medical reports.

For patients who need to be seen but where there is a significant risk that they may have Covid19 infection, we are supporting and have access to GP appointments at Wareham Hospital with enhanced infection control procedures.

The Social Distancing has helped all those that are over 70 or have significant health conditions to be safe during their isolation. It is vital that this group maintains their isolation, as each time they go out they are at risk of catching the virus, which in their case is much more likely to be fatal.

In addition, 400 patients in Swanage, (the very high-risk group), have been asked to 'shield', meaning that, in addition to the above, they need to maintain Social Distancing within their own home and from family members.

Staying at home has prevented the overwhelming of the NHS, with the number of daily deaths from the virus now beginning to fall. However there seems to be an increase in other deaths, suggesting the NHS is not being used when it should be. So long as Social Distancing is maintained it does seem the hospitals, the out of hours services, and us at Swanage Medical Practice have capacity to deal with any normal medical emergencies and urgent cases.

We are lucky to have wonderful opportunities for walking, running and cycling from our doorsteps in Swanage. There is no medical condition that this will not help.

For those over 70 and at high risk who need to stay at home this is also important. Everyone should ensure they get up and walk around their home for 2 minutes every hour. My Mother at 90 asked for her old exercise bike back from our garage and is now using it at least twice a day!

I thought NHS Thursday was a good day each week to report on progress so here goes. As of yesterday evening I had walked 1,611,567 steps which is roughly 800 miles and I have had sponsorship so far of £587.50 which is amazing.

Thank you so much to all who have contributed so far.

Just in case you are wondering how this fits in with lockdown, I set off early in the morning when there are very few people about and I walk from Herston along the back road past Godlingston Cemetery and the brickworks to Ulwell then down to the seafront along to the pier up along to Peveril Point then Home. I am very careful to avoid contact by social distancing (I rarely see more than a dozen people and a few dogs on my whole journey). That is my 14,000 steps I need each day to finish in time. I do a few more steps around my tiny garden then!

SWANAGE SPECIAL AMBULANCE CAR

In the light of the Covid-19 emergency, Dorset Clinical Commissioning Group (GGC) have agreed to continue funding the Swanage ambulance car, after South West Ambulance Trust (SWAST) had decided to withdraw it. It will remain working from Swanage Ambulance Station, at least for the duration of this emergency.

COVID-19 WASTE SERVICES UPDATE

• **Garden Waste Service** resumed from Monday 27 April – usual day - but new garden subscriptions are still suspended.

- **Food, recycling, rubbish and glass collections** – taking place as usual
- **Household recycling centres (HRCs) remain closed**

• **Street cleansing (inc. bin emptying)** – less frequently, but as usual in most areas

HOW TO HELP YOUR COLLECTION CREWS

With the “Lockdown” there has been an increase in rubbish and recycling at the kerbside. At a time when our workforce is stretched, this can be challenging.

SUGGESTIONS

- **Make sure your bins are out by 6AM on your collection day**
- **Please continue to put the right stuff in the right bin**
- **Do not overfill any recycling box or bin higher than the top of the box/bin**
- **If you have excess recycling (especially glass) please place it out for collection in a sturdy container that can be easily lifted by 1 person without spilling the contents**

COVID-19 and Emergency Local Assistance (ELA)

ELA has been a valuable resource to Dorset residents for a number of years, providing practical and financial support to individuals and families in a time of crisis or extreme financial hardship. In response to COVID-19 and to ensure that we continue to provide support to our communities in these uncertain times, the support that can be provided by ELA has changed slightly to reflect demand.

What support is available?

Now, rather than receiving a ready-made food parcel we are providing a pre-paid card that will allow you to purchase food and essentials for yourself and your family. If you are self-isolating or you are having difficulty getting to the shops (e.g. mobility, transport) then we can make a referral to our partner agency Dorset First Point who can collect the 'essentials' you require and drop-off at your property. Dorset First Point can provide guidance around benefits, housing, budgeting or linking you to a more local resource in your community.

We can also provide support with utilities. We can check that you have maximised the offers provided by your utilities provider, or we will try to make a top-up payment on your behalf either over the phone or on-line whilst we are talking to you. If this is not an option with your particular energy supplier, we will again send out a pre-paid card.

Although food and utilities are the focus, if you are an organisation working with somebody who is experiencing circumstances such as leaving hospital or being housed temporarily, and they do not have the necessary basics at home (e.g. bed or cooker) please get in touch and we will see if we can help. There may be some funding available or we may be able to link you to other useful local resources.

News from Trading Standards **Warning about scams**

Fraudsters are increasingly targeting the public and organisations with emails, texts, phone calls and WhatsApp messages offering advice and treatment for the coronavirus, as well as setting up fake websites selling products and offering 'cures'.

Scammers have also been setting up bogus websites asking for donations for victims or promoting awareness and prevention tips.

Cold callers have been contacting organisations suggesting they must have certain measures in place by a certain deadline.

To help members of the public protect themselves from becoming a victim of fraud, the advice from Dorset Council Trading Standard is:

- Be sceptical if you receive an email, text or WhatsApp message about the coronavirus, and never click on any attachments or links
- Never provide personal data such as your full name, address and date of birth – scammers can use this information to steal your identity
- Don't allow yourself to be pressured into donating money, and never make donations by cash or gift card, or send money through transfer agents such as Western Union or Moneygram
- If you think you've been the victim of a scam, then speak to your bank immediately and report any fraud to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040

Swanage Community Defibrillator Partnership

Keep the heart of Swanage beating



We continue to monitor both defibs and cabinets and have noticed that 5 cabinets are showing signs of wear, with instruction information 'rubbing off'. New temporary signage will be applied until new cabinet doors can be replaced or modified..

Last month we highlighted the advice given by the Resuscitation Council UK that any person needing a defibrillator may have COVID19 and extra precautions should be taken; cardiac arrest should be recognised by looking for the absence of normal breathing but rescuers should not listen for breathing by placing an ear and cheek close to the patient's mouth.

If there is any doubt about confirming cardiac arrest the default position is to start cardiac compressions making sure that an ambulance is on its way by calling 999.

This guidance has not changed for the public. SCDP will monitor the advice regularly in case it changes or as the Coronavirus develops.

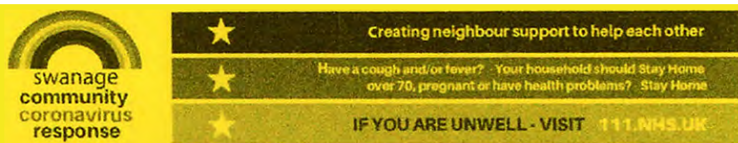
SWANAGE ROTARY may not be operating as normal at the moment, but it's still here in the heart of your community and willing to help.

POOR OLD ALBERT

The Swanage Albert Memorial, the first to be raised in the country in his honour at the top of Court Hill, has had a sad and sorry history. Now, when it seemed that it would be re-erected, things have had to be put on hold.

In 2017 a group of members of the Research Group of Swanage Museum made a concerted action to try and get the Memorial raised for the bi-centenary of Prince Albert's birth, 26th of August 2019. This obviously didn't happen. I wrote an article for the *Purbeck Gazette* in October 2017. I contacted Nick Churchill and he wrote an article for *Dorset Life, A Monumental Task* March 2019 issue.

This second article resulted in a person getting in touch with me who has been coming to Swanage since childhood, as his parents had a holiday home on Peveril Point, as he himself does now. He offered financial help with getting the Albert Memorial re-erected and meetings were set up with him, the Mayor, Bob Foster of the Swanage and Purbeck Development Trust and myself. This resulted in a site at the top corner of Prince Albert Gardens as being the best. Dorset County Council are happy with the plan and said there was no point in going for Pre-Planning but just to submit the Planning Application. To go ahead with this a site survey was needed. The benefactor agreed to supply funds for both these things to be done. The Site Survey was about to be undertaken when the site investigation surveyors told us that the work is outside of the Government's definition of "essential" construction works and that they will not, therefore, be able to carry out the borehole testing in April, as originally planned. The surveyors said that they would get back to us at the earliest opportunity. We cannot go forward for full planning consent until this is eventually done, so the project is on hold.

The benefactor is keen that the community of Swanage is involved with this important project. To this end we were planning an Open Meeting to outline the history of the monument and its importance as Swanage as being the first place in the country to erect a memorial in Albert's memory. And also to present and show the plans, and to enlist support and funds from the citizens of Swanage. This cannot now happen until the present crisis is over.

George Burt commissioned this globe in 1879 and it was made under the direction of his friend Professor James Hunter of Aberdeen. The globe is 3ft in diameter and is made of granite. It stood in the garden of Purbeck House, in Swanage High Street. George Burt's daughter, Annie, shown here beside the globe, occupied the house until her death in 1918. After the First World War, the Burt's Estate, including Purbeck House, was put up for auction and Burt's grandson, Edwin, transferred this globe to the gardens of a house he bought adjoining the river at Beaulieu.



Swanage Museum has accepted the offer to bring this very unique historic item to Swanage. It will have to be lifted and transported, then stored before finding a final resting place suitable for its historic significance and beauty and with your help we can make this dream come true.

NHS workers urged to apply for water bill support

Frontline NHS workers who are required to wash their uniform at home separately and more often during the current coronavirus (Covid-19) outbreak can apply for a water bill rebate from Wessex Water.
