RAMBLES AROUND STUDLAND.


FROM SWANAGE

TROM BANKARON

TO STUDLAND.

ET us now set out on a walk from Swanage to beautiful, seeluded Studland. Beginning our journey at the Church Bridge, and pursuing it by the old Priest's Way, now Northbrook Lane, we arrive at a junction at the

cross roads near Swanage Farm, where we find that the east branch, or Washpond Lane, leads to Whitecliff Farm, and up over the hill to Studland. Traces of the old cart track over the hill can still be seen. The western branch from Swanage Farm leads on to Godlingstone Farm and continues to Corfe Castle, under the south side of the hill. It is probable that this road was used by King John and his retinue when the King visited the neighbourhood for sporting and other purposes when the cares of State permitted. The Isle of Purbeck Royal Warren or Deer Park then extended from Whitecliff Farm on the east to Tyneham on the west. Reverting to the cross roads at Swanage Farm, we remind our readers that the present road, running from Ulwell to the shore, was not then in existence, but was only a farm cart track. Leaving Swanage Farm and going through Dark Lane, another junction is reached, where
