Subject: We need your views on proposed PSPOs

Good morning,

<u>Dorset Council has launched a public consultation</u>, asking for views on eight proposed Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs). We'd appreciate if you could review the proposals and take part in the consultation by completing the surveys.

Included in the proposals are 2 PSPOs which outline measures to address issues around camping on beaches and to help with the prevention of wildfires. The draft <u>Dorset Beaches PSPO</u> and <u>Open Land PSPO</u> cover areas where the council has evidence of a significant and continued increase in complaints, damage and destruction of natural habitat. These are the key areas identified and additional areas will be considered as part of the ongoing consultation process.

A further six PSPOs are proposed to replace existing Orders that cover West Dorset and Weymouth and Portland, which are due to expire next year. The new PSPOs are set at town level for Weymouth, Portland, Dorchester, Bridport, West Bay and Lyme Regis and aim to renew and introduce powers that can be used by the council and partners to address anti-social behaviour.
