I contacted Dorset Council reference a recommendation of a zebra crossing to be installed at Herston and they told me to contact yourselves. We live near the Costcutter store at Herston, Swanage and the traffic is becoming a major issue due to the illegal parking on double yellow lines outside the store and even in the bus stop. We have witnessed numerous near misses, aggressive drivers, horns and congestion on a daily basis. There are also a large number of school children returning from and to the Swanage School and they cross outside the shop but with cars in the way. This will end in a dangerous accident if something isn't done soon.

I would suggest a zebra crossing be added on or near the drop curve outside the shop and also regular visits by a parking attendant to issue tickets as this is something I have never witnessed. Even through the cars only park for a short period of time, it is constant and when one leaves it is replaced by another. When buses try and pull in, the tail backs and sounding of horns get worse.

Any updates on this? I have just witnessed another close call with two young girls crossing the road where 6 cars were illegally parked on double yellow lines. It's a daily occurrence.


Email received 23rd January 2023:





